








Tree selections for locations with no overhead overhead Electric Wire obstructions

Tree Species*	Comments	Example (at Maturity)	Leaf Example
Oak	<p>Variety: Chestnut. Height at Maturity: 60 - 70' Width at Maturity: 50 - 60' Leaves: Dark green on top and silvery-whit underneath, turning orange-gold to yellow in fall. Other: Native. Many birds and animals eat the fruit. Attractive to pollinators.</p>		
Red Maple	<p>Cultivars: Autumn Blaze or October Glory Height at Maturity: 40 - 50' Width at Maturity: 40 - 50' Leaves: Turn a vibrant red in fall. Other: Native. Most common tree in this area. Attractive to pollinators.</p>		
Littleleaf Linden	<p>Height at Maturity: 60-70' Width at Maturity: 35-50' Leaves: Small, heart-shaped. Dark green top, light green underside. Turn yellow in fall. Other: Attractive to pollinators.</p>		
American Linden	<p>Height at Maturity: 60-80' Width at Maturity: 30-60' Leaves: Large heart-shaped. Dark green top, light green underside. Turn pale yellow in fall. Other: Native. Attractive to pollinators.</p>		
Sycamore	<p>Variety: London Plane Height at Maturity: ' Width at Maturity: ' Leaves: Large. Turn yellow in fall. Other: Hybrid. Distinctive, exfoliating bark.</p>

Tree Species*	Comments	Example (at Maturity)	Leaf Example
Tupalo/ Black Gum	<p>Cultivar: Afterburner or Green Gable.</p> <p>Height at Maturity: 35-45'</p> <p>Width at Maturity: 15-20'</p> <p>Leaves: Dark green. Turn firey red in fall.</p> <p>Other: Native. Small, white flowers attract polinators in Spring. Small blue/black fruit feed birds and small animals in fall.</p>	 <p style="text-align: center;">Blackgum <i>Nyssa sylvatica</i></p>	
Sweet Gum	<p>Cultivar: Moraine.</p> <p>Height at Maturity: 35-45'</p> <p>Width at Maturity: 30-35'</p> <p>Leaves: Star shaped. Turn red in fall.</p> <p>Other: Native. Deep, corky bark. Round (1" dia.) fruit. Best in naturalized location, without sidewalks.</p>		
Elm	<p>Cultivar: Patriot</p> <p>Height at Maturity: 40-50'</p> <p>Width at Maturity: 30-40'</p> <p>Leaves: Green serrated. Turn Yellow in fall.</p> <p>Other: Non-native hybrid.</p>	 <p style="text-align: center;">American Elm <i>Ulmus americana</i></p>	
Ginkgo (Ginkgo biloba)	<p>Cultivar: Princeton Sentry</p> <p>Height at Maturity: 25-45'</p> <p>Width at Maturity: 20-25'</p> <p>Leaves: Fan shaped. Turn yellow in Fall.</p> <p>Other: Pest free. Fruitless.</p>	 <p style="text-align: center;">Ginkgo <i>Ginkgo biloba</i></p>
