‘All employees hired after implementation date of this Collective Bargaining Agreement shall participate in a 401(a) type pension plan with no eligibility or vesting rights in the Town’s existing Pension System. The employee shall be required to contribute at least four percent (4%) of base salary to the Plan and may contribute up to the maximum allowed by law. The Town shall match the employee’s contribution up to a maximum of four percent (4%) of base salary. The Town’s contribution shall no vest until the employee has been continuously employed five (5) years.’”

11. To hear, consider and act upon the following resolution as recommended by the Board of Education:

“RESOLVED, that the following changes to Article XIV Pension Program of the Town of Fairfield Pension Plan provisions in the Special Education Trainers labor agreement negotiated by and between the Town of Fairfield and Fairfield Board of Education/Special Education Trainers be, and hereby are, approved:

‘All employees hired after implementation date of this Collective Bargaining Agreement shall participate in a 401(a) type pension plan with no eligibility or vesting rights in the Town’s existing Pension System. The employee shall be required to contribute at least four percent (4%) of base salary to the Plan and may contribute up to the maximum allowed by law. The Town shall match the employee’s contribution up to a maximum of four percent (4%) of base salary.
